GMC 49ers Business Meeting

September 8-10, 2023, Oroville

President, Nick Roenick, called the meeting to order at 9:39 a.m.

No new members. No guests.

There were no corrections or omissions to the Minutes of the previous meeting. George Beckman motioned to accept the Minutes as written. Ruth Beckman seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report – Jack Christensen

Current balance in our account was \$3301.77

Annual dues, acceptable now, will change as of October 1, 2023 and will be \$35, an increase of \$10/year. There is \$1300 available for the Anniversary rally in November. The club has been retaining \$2500 and several members felt the amount should be \$2000. A lengthy discussion followed regarding the overage, and Carla Bolton motioned that we continue with the \$2500 balance until the anniversary rally and then put the overage in a special portion of the current account (a ledger item) and save for the 50th Anniversary rally. Anything left going forward will be earmarked for the 50th Anniversary. After the 2023 Anniversary rally, the overage goes back down to \$2000. George Beckman seconded. Motion passed.

FMCA Report - Liaison, Dean Hanson

Members are encouraged to attend the January rally in Indio CA. If you want the details of the rally, you can find it on the FMCA website. The subject of members' relationships with AAA was discussed at great length. Jim Kanomata reminded us that we must be members of FMCA, as Forty Niner members. They provide the insurance for our rallies. Also on a side note, we were reminded to always carry a socket for your particular lug nuts (speaking from experience).

Sunshine Report - Alyce Shutzbaugh

John Shutzbaugh shared a few touching memories about Gene, followed by Alyce's request for a donation from our club of \$100 to the Fisher family for a charity of their choice in Gene's memory. John Shutzbaugh made the motion. Kathy Nehl seconded. Motion passed.

Secretary Report - George Beckman

George handed out the current 2023 rosters to those who did not have one. He also reminded us to send him any photos you may have taken at this rally if you want them included in the newsletter.

Debra Taylor, who handles our Facebook account, is looking for someone to co-administrate it with her. Discussion followed regarding access as well as password for the account. The information would be given to new members of the club. It was also suggested that this password be changed on a yearly basis. George Beckman motioned for this to take place. Donna Ventura Roenick seconded. Motion passed.
